# A WORD FROM DAN



A new year brings with it new opportunities. This month I will be highlighting adult education opportunities for you at Desert Skies. Did you know that we offer Adult Sunday School every week? Each Sunday at 8:30 am the LaPortes teach a lively discussion based class that is open to everyone.

In addition there are two new opportunities for adults during the week. Beginning on January 10th I will be leading a class using John Wesley's "A Plain Account of Christian Perfection." This is a short (about sixty pages) but dense book that Wesley finalized in 1777. The purpose was to help the reader to gain the mind of Christ. The group will meet through February 28<sup>th</sup> for 90 minutes. It is free and open to anyone who is interested.

Another great opportunity beginning in January is Financial Peace University. Financial Peace is a program developed by popular radio and t.v. host Dave Ramsey. This video based curriculum will be facilitated by Larry Callen, a retired banker and member of Desert Skies. Financial Peace will be taught on Wednesday nights. This course is designed to help participants learn healthy financial habits. There is a cost of \$100 per family. While this may seem kind of high there are two things to think about. First, the course promises that if one applies the principals to that are taught the \$100 will be recouped in a few weeks. The second thing is that there is a psychological component in that if one invests in the program one is more likely to attend and take the lessons seriously.

All of these education opportunities are a chance for you to work on your Spiritual life, to grow closer to God and make new friends at Desert Skies. There is no better time than a new year to take advantage of such a great opportunity. Sign up's for my Tuesday class and Financial Peace University are available in the office.

# PASTOR BRIAN

Happy New Year Desert Skies!

While the New Year is not officially a Christian holiday, it is certainly a holiday that we as a people of faith can understand. As Disciples of Christ we are continually called to die to our old ways of being and to be reborn in new and powerful ways to life in Christ. I find that the New Year is a wonderful opportunity to take inventory of who we are, who we are called to be, and how we might move further along our path from one to the other.

This year I can't help but think about how much of my life is spent thinking about money. As a man of God I feel forever torn between two seemingly opposing notions. On the one hand I find Jesus' reminder to me not to worry about money, to be more generous with the gifts God has given me and to put my faith in God, not money, to provide what I need and to see me through difficult times. On the other I recognize my earthly responsibilities to pay my debts, care for my needs and the needs of my family, and to prepare for unexpected financial difficulties. I don't think there is an easy answer to these questions, but I do feel it is my responsibility as a Disciple of Christ to continue to wrestle with this issue in authentic ways.

My wife and I have decided to continue to wrestle with our fiscal responsibilities to God and to others by participating in Financial Peace University, a program that will be offered here at Desert Skies beginning in January. It is \$100 to sign up for the class and, while that is a lot of money for us, we have decided that we owe it to ourselves and to our journey of discipleship as partners to do some of this work in community and to seek out the wisdom of folk who have been at this much longer than we have. Our hope and prayer is that through this class we will learn how to get control of our money so that our money does not control us, so that we do not live in fear or regret, and so that we might be freed to focus more of our time and energy on the things God has called us to.

If you feel bound by your financial situation, if you feel out of control or always a bit behind, or if you're just looking for opportunities to grow deeper in your discipleship and financial faithfulness to God, I hope you will consider joining us for this class. I think we will find that, as we journey together, we have much to learn from one another, and much to learn from Jesus Christ, about how to have life, and life abundantly!

17 December Meeting

The DSUM Men had their monthly meeting at the Fellowship Hall where after a tasty breakfast prepared by Bob Wood, Gordon Briggs and Jerry Myers the men had a short business meeting.

We reviewed several requests for donations and decided because it was the holiday season, when local charities had a high demand for goods, we would send \$300 each to the Community Food Bank and the Salvation Army. We also agreed to send \$1000.00 to Therapeutic Riding of Tucson (TROT) to adopt Sparky the horse for a year.

After elections that elected Dave Chittenden as President and Gordon Briggs as Treasurer, Clyde van Arsdale introduced our speaker for the morning, Ms Susan Curtis Drop-out Prevention Specialist from Catalina High School and head of their Wellness Center. The Wellness Center has a clothing Bank and a Food Bank that support many children that attend school at Catalina High School, including 200 refugees and kids from Homeless Shelters and Foster Care who would otherwise not be attending High School.

They get the refugee children from the Interfaith Rescue Committee, The Catholic Social Services and the Lutheran Social Services who get refugees from various Refugee Camps throughout the world and bring them to America for a better life. They also have Native American Children who for various reasons are not supported on the reservations yet have children who need to go to school and whose families need the support of the Clothing and Food Banks.

The Wellness Center also has an English Language Learning Center to help the students learn English for school. At the end of the presentation we gave her \$200.00 to help with the support banks and set up a liaison with Clyde Van Arsdale to provide clothing and whatever else was needed to support her students. The meeting was adjourned with the joint recitation of the Lord’s Prayer.

The next meeting will be on 21 January 2012, with a golf Tournament to follow at 12:00, Location to be announced.

### HEALTH CARE FOCUS:

#### HOW SCRIPTURE, TRADITION REASON,& EXPERIENCE INFORM US

From the very beginning of creation, Health and Wholeness is the ultimate design of God for humanity. Though life often thwarts that design, the health we have is a good gift of God.

Many of the accounts of Jesus' ministry document how Jesus saw restoration to health as a sign of the Kingdom of Heaven becoming present amongst us. The biblical narrative is filled with stories of God's healing presence in the world. This includes spiritual, psychological, emotional, social, as well as physical healing. Christ's healing ministry to all persons, even to the marginalized, put into practice this desire of God and expanded God's promises to the entire world.

John Wesley not only preached spiritual health, he worked to restore physical health among the impoverished people who heard his call. He wrote *Primitive Physick*, a primer on health and medicine for those too poor to pay for a doctor. He encouraged Methodists to support the healthcare needs of the poor.

The United Methodist Church's General Conference has passed a number of health-related resolutions elaborating on the importance of health care for all, and some of the significant issues that keep us from realizing this principle. Health care in the U.S. is beset by three problems - cost, access, and quality. Because of deficiencies in the current system, Americans as a whole receive poorer health care than other industrial countries that spend only half as much. The most visible problem is the 46 million Americans who have no health insurance.

DSUMC, with three other local congregations, is planning a health care justice event in early February at Tanque Verde Lutheran Church. Focus will be the current affordable health care act, in promoting better understanding of its impact on the insured, underinsured and uninsured. Watch bulletin for details! Scripture references: Ezekiel 34:4, Luke 10:25-35 and 3 John 1:2.
