Mark your calendars now for a new Desert Skies Picture Directory.

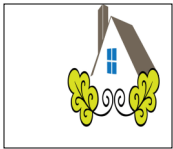
Our initial photography dates are Friday, February 10th and Saturday, February 11th, 2011. Our photographers will once again be Olan Mills.

From time to time, I will tell a joke that just isn't funny. Some of this comes from an over active sense of humor. Some of it comes from the old spaghetti at the wall approach to humor, "throw everything at the wall and see if something sticks." Most of the mistakes I have made trying to be funny have resulted from the same problem which is not thinking through what I was about to say.

We have seen a dip in our worship attendance numbers as of late. I have made a few phone calls to some who have been absent in order to inquire why we have been missing them in church. I have gotten a variety of answers. One person said, "We have just been lazy." Some have sighted the construction on both Tanque Verde (which is now complete) and Speedway (which isn't complete just yet). Others cited personal reasons they asked me not to share.

One disturbing report I heard from two different people went something like this, "well, the last time I was there someone came up to me and told me I was sitting in their pew. I decided never to make that mistake again." I really hope that you are as shocked by that story as I am. I truly never expected to hear that story about Desert Skies. I want to acknowledge that perhaps the person who was laying claim to the pew was just joking around. What I do know is that there are people who will likely not be back because of those comments.

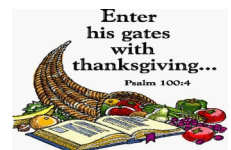
I am reminded of Elwood P. Dowd, the main character in "Harvey" who quipped, "no one brings anything small into a bar." While I have limited bar experience I can say that his saying is certainly true of the church, especially when it comes to people who are worshipping with us for the first time. I know of people who have come to worship because their marriage has fallen apart. I know people who have come back to church because a spouse has died. I know people who have come to our church for the first time because they have just moved the whole family all the way across the country. I know people who have come to church to give it another chance after a crisis of faith. Often times people who are "trying out" Desert Skies are doing so because they are particularly fragile. I also know many "old timers" here who often attend with heavy hearts because of the weeks events.

I would suggest a couple of ideas. First, I know it is important to be comfortable. If you really need to sit in exactly the same place each week—get here early. I remember one couple at a church I served would always be in "their seats" before I entered the building at least 30 minutes before the earliest service started. The person who is most apt to not know they are taking "your seat" is a relative newcomer, who more than anyone else, needs to be made to feel comfortable and at home. If you can't get here early, move around a little. Sit by somebody you don't know and get to know them. You might end up with a new friend.

Keep an eye out for the new person because God may have set him or her in "your pew" for a reason. And, if you are ever tempted to tease someone even a little bit for "sitting in your pew", remember, as I always say, for good or ill "I do the jokes."

REV. BRIAN

Greetings in the name of the one who calls us into new life!

In the miraculous story of feeding in the gospel of Matthew, we hear that at one time Jesus had five thousand men, not including women and children, who followed him on foot from the towns to hear his teachings and experience his healing (Matt 14:13-21). In the gospel of Luke we are told that seventy were commissioned to go out ahead of Christ to prepare for his arrival in towns across the countryside (Luke 10:1). When it came to calling disciples however, Matthew 10 names only twelve people (Matt 10:1-4). As we focus on our church's mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world we might contemplate these verses and ask ourselves, "What is the difference between a follower of Christ, those called to a particular task, and a disciple of Jesus?"

On his popular blog, *Shaun in the City*, new church start pastor Shaun King recalls that attendance and giving in his faith community were never higher than as he preached a fiery sermon series about how Christ was calling them into transformation from hearers of the word on Sunday morning to doers of the word. Folks were excited to hear about a life changing Christ who offered grace to them and then gave them the opportunity to be a part of the transforming the world they knew into God's Kingdom on Earth. Subsequently he shares that his attendance and giving were never as low as when he stopped preaching and began leading his congregation out into the streets to serve the community around them. In the end he suggests, "that ZERO CORRELATION exists between how much people love hearing about change and their actual willingness to make it."

I don't know that I agree that there is zero correlation between those of us who feel passionate about Christ's message of discipleship and those of us who are willing to be transformed by it, but I do believe that those two groups of people are not always the same. The truth is that God's grace is available to all of God's people, and the church, at our best, is a place where that grace is extended to all. Disciples are those who respond to that grace by allowing God to radically transform them from admirers of Christ to followers of Christ. It involves dying to our old way of life, and being reborn into new life of servant leadership and compassionate accountability. This journey of discipleship, or sanctification as we call it in our Wesleyan heritage, is not an easy one, but it is a journey that offers purpose, fulfillment, and true life to those who would accept Christ's call.

As we vision together about who we will be as individuals of faith and a body of faith, I pray that we continue to extend God's grace to all those who seek it, welcoming anyone who comes to us in search of God's redemptive work in Christ. I also pray that we not stop there, but continue to offer people opportunities to go deeper in their walk of faith, moving from listeners, hearers of the word into a journey of discipleship that will lead us back to who God created us to be.

MISSIONS MOMENT

A big "Thank You" to everyone who donated items included in UMCOR's Health Kits! Your generosity will benefit people affected by emergencies and disasters, just like this year's tornados and the widespread flooding at home and overseas. Having the means to wash up raises spirits and helps the displaced regain some dignity. As a service project, the UMYF is putting the kits together and shipping them to UMCOR'S Salt Lake City warehouse. Stay tuned for the number of kits assembled!

Our church was contacted with an urgent request for help from TMM because of a huge shortage of children's undergarments. A large number of children brought to TMM from unstable homes arrive with only the clothes on their backs. TMM does receive donations of used clothing for the children, but they cannot clothe them in used underwear. The Missions Committee has made a donation of \$1,000 to TMM to help purchase a range of undergarments for young boys and girls through to older teens.

Missions also gave a gift of \$1,000 to St. Luke's Home, an assisted living facility for the elderly with limited financial means, on Adams Street here in Tucson.

The second request was to raise a living room chair 3" to 4" so it could be used for physical therapy. A platform was built and fitted to the chair to obtain the desired result. This same individual requested portions of her porch be enclosed to block high winds. Clear plastic panels were cut and secured to existing railings to block some of the wind. Thanks to Lynn Adams for doing the work.

The purchase of a new stove for the church was discussed to include cost estimates and possible replacement models. Representatives of the flea market who were present reported the flea market has been having a good year and volunteered to purchase a stove for the church. The UMM thank the flea market for their generosity and believes the church and everyone that uses the kitchen will benefit from the purchase.

The men want to thank John Wessels for contributing 590 beanie babies for Operation Care Package. As discussed at last months church council meeting these beanie babies will be provided to U.S. Forces in Afghanistan for distribution to Afghan children.

Our next meeting will be on Saturday, November 19th in the Fellowship Hall at 8:00 am. All men of the church are invited for breakfast and fellowship.

This class is open to everyone - not just church members. Please pray about attending, and perhaps you might like to sponsor someone else to attend by providing a scholarship.

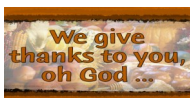

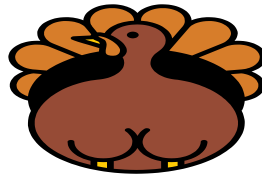
