A WORD FROM DAN



The other day I was driving from far East Mesa back home to Tucson. I choose the route through Florence because it is much more relaxing than I-10. I was listening to a program on the radio about how teenagers learn (and why they often seem not too). The subject of reading came up.

One of the experts noted that human beings have been around a long time and there have been somewhere between 100 and 200 billion people who have ever lived. Because written communication has only been around a relatively short while a very small percentage of humanity has been literate and an even smaller percentage of our learning has come through reading. He was emphasizing the fact that we learn through multiple channels we learn better through some than others.

We are people whose story is contained in written form in the Bible. I am surprised at how often a dispute results in one Christian telling another to “read your Bible.” I would like to go on record at this moment as saying I believe “read your Bible” is always good advice. However, when that is shouted in anger I am not sure the point comes across in the way Jesus would like us to make it.

Our story is contained in the Bible, and if folks are to become Christian they will need to study that story, but there are many more ways of sharing our faith. For the sake of argument I would suggest that we are at our Gospel sharing best when our very lives are telling the story of Jesus. When other Christians recognize Jesus in our words and actions and when strangers wonder why we would be helping someone we do not know.

So Christian, “read your Bible.” Even more importantly live out what you have read. For the majority of the history of humankind we have learned by observing and imitating the positive, successful example of others. May we learn and live the example of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

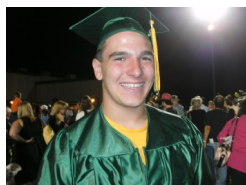


Alternative Gift Giving

Greeting Desert Skies!

As we transition out of summer and into fall I have to share with you that I am ready for a change. Not that summer didn't come with plenty of changes for Summer and me. She got here just in time to see me commissioned and then see me off on a whirlwind month of youth travel that included two weeks in Honduras. I returned and we both spent the next few weeks preparing for Kansas and what turned out to be a beautiful wedding and then hurried home to close on the first house either of us has ever owned. Believe me when I tell you that we have had enough change to last us a good long while!

In fact, the change that I am ready for is the exact opposite of what we experienced this summer. It can be both fun and exciting to constantly be jumping into new things, but once the adrenaline wears off, we all begin the process of living into the lives we have built for ourselves. The change I am ready for this fall doesn't involve whirlwind trips or new adventures but settling into our lives together and enjoying some peaceful moments of prayer and conversation with God, our youth, and with each of you. Big change can be exciting, but real transformation comes in the small changes we make in our daily walk with God and with one another.

Our lives of faith can sometimes be like this. The men were also briefed on the existence of "Operation Care Package", sponsored by KNST Radio, Dunkin Donuts, and three other organizations. One aspect of the program involves providing beanie babies to U.S. Forces in Afghanistan for distribution to Afghan children. This is one method our forces use in attempting to win the hearts and minds of the local people. This matter is also pending.

Our guest speaker was Mr. Russell Burns, host of the Care Connection Show on radio station KVO1 am. Mr Burns provided an interesting talk on providing information and resources for seniors and those who care for them.
